### **OVERVIEW** 31 Counties 803 girl participants 480K views across digital platforms

The 2024 Girl Up Kenya Leadership Summit was hosted for the first time in Nairobi, on **July 26-27**, **2024.** It brought together over **800 girls** and youth advocates from around the country to harness their power for change! This year's Leadership Summit theme was **Unlimited-Girls Lead** celebrating girls limitless potential, encouraging them to embrace their strength, voice your issues, break barriers, and chase their dreams with confidence and empowerment. **The future is theirs to shape!**. The focus was on promoting the balance of mental wellness, celebrating wins in gender equity, voicing our issues, telling our stories of impact, and encouraging further activism in our communities and beyond.

# MENSTRUAL HEALTH/SRHR

#### Advancing Equity: Addressing the Challenge of Period Poverty

The Center for Reproductive Rights Africa led a side event on Menstrual Hygiene and Adolescent Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (ASRHR) with a thematic focus on '**The Policy and Legal Aspects of ASRHR**'. This session provided a platform to educate girls on the legal and policy dimensions of ASRHR, raise awareness on issues such as teen pregnancy and school reentry policies, and address the lack of access to sexual and reproductive health information and services. The session also shed light on the intersections between ASRHR issues and education, health, economic advancement, social empowerment, and leadership of young girls. By engaging girls with their peers, we facilitated a dynamic environment where they could share their perspectives, be inspired, and learn from one another. The enthusiasm and engagement witnessed at the summit reaffirms their commitment to fostering a future where young women and girls are empowered to lead and advocate for their rights.

**Girl Effect** and the **Malkia Initiative** also not only provided fun and educational games and dance challenges but also offered valuable insights into menstrual hygiene. **Could You** facilitators demonstrated how to properly insert, remove, and clean menstrual cups, emphasizing their benefits for both personal health and environmental sustainability. Girls were guided through step-by-step instructions and given the opportunity to ask questions and practice in a supportive setting. This hands-on education aimed to empower girls with knowledge about menstrual cups as a viable and eco-friendly alternative, enhancing their menstrual hygiene management and promoting confidence in handling their own health.

Together for Better Foundation played a key role in empowering girls in Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) and leadership. They organized DIY sanitary pad kit training sessions for 100 girls, equipping them with essential skills for sustainable menstrual health management. The CEO, Dr. Aruna, participated in panel discussions, sharing insights on girls' empowerment, and further supported the cause by donating 250 reusable pad kits to the attendees.

These sessions marked a significant step toward breaking down barriers to education and leadership, providing young girls with the resources and knowledge they need to succeed.

### GIRLS' RIGHTS ARE HUMAN RIGHTS

## **GENDER-BASED** VIOLENCE

#### Sponsored by UN Women & Oxfam-Kenya

This side event brought together a diverse group of advocates, survivors, and experts to address pressing issues and propose solutions. The event highlighted the alarming prevalence of GBV in Kenya and the broader region, emphasizing its impact on girls' and women's physical and mental well-being.

Key discussions included the need for comprehensive legal frameworks to protect survivors, the importance of educational programs to challenge harmful norms, and the role of community involvement in supporting victims and preventing violence. Speakers shared personal stories and case studies, showcasing successful interventions and the ongoing challenges faced in eradicating GBV.



Participants also engaged in discussions on how to develop actionable strategies, such as improving access to support services, strengthening reporting mechanisms, and fostering collaboration between government, NGOs, and local communities.

Thank you UN Women and Oxfam Kenya for this lifechanging experience. With my own journey as a survivor, I am now more than ever dedicated to fighting against gender-based violence and advocating for the rights of survivors. I understand the unique privilege of being able to engage with fellow changemakers and policy makers to address and rectify injustices I have faced. #### Feminizing Political Spaces SPONSORED BY: UN WOMEN & BADILI AFRICA

At this side event, young women from diverse backgrounds came together to explore and develop their leadership skills. Interactive sessions were led by young women moderators from Badili Africa, with Hon. Millie Odhiambo and Hon. Njeri Maina offering valuable insights on achieving leadership roles. The event included activities focused on building confidence, strategic thinking, and effective communication. It also provided networking opportunities for participants to connect with role models and peers. By the end, the attendees left feeling empowered and inspired to advance their leadership goals.







## PROFESSIONAL MAKEUP ARTIST COMPETITION

#### **SPONSORED BY: MAKE-UP BY ROSE**

Youth leaders with interested in the beauty economy were presented with an opportunity to pitch to win a 1 month long professional make up training. Aimed at empowering girls and young women, by providing advanced makeup techniques, mentorship and industry insights to enhance participants' skills for potential career opportunities. The training will not only build their confidence but also equipped them with the skills to pursue financially independent careers in the beauty industry. A panel of judges from Girl Up Kenya and Make Up by Rose selected 5 winners from over 212 submissions.












# **INSPIRE** SESSIONS



At the Summit, Girl Up Kenya created a dedicated space for girls to intentionally share their activism stories. Five girl speakers led their own "Inspire Sessions," crafting self-directed, interactive discussions on topics related to gender justice, mental health or their personal advocacy experiences. Attendees participated in these short, peer-to-peer learning sessions, exploring various advocacy strategies and methods for fostering responsible activism. ### **ALL THINGS** WOMEN ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

### **SPONSORED BY:** CRAWN TRUST

The Economic Empowerment Side Event, sponsored by **CRAWN Trust**, featured a dynamic panel discussion with accomplished women sharing their real-life success stories. The panelists offered inspiring insights into overcoming challenges and achieving financial independence, covering topics such as entrepreneurship, career growth, and financial management. Attendees benefited from practical advice and engaged in an interactive Q&A session, fostering a rich exchange of ideas. The session highlighted CRAWN Trust's dedication to advancing women's economic empowerment and provided participants with valuable tools and motivation to pursue their own economic goals.



### **ALL THINGS** STEM **Sponsored by:** Girl Code

The STEM Side Event empowered girls by providing hands-on training in coding and IT robotics. Participants engaged in interactive workshops where they developed coding skills and worked with robots, gaining practical experience and confidence in technology. Guided by industry experts from **Girl Code**, the sessions covered fundamental programming and robotics, inspiring attendees to pursue further education and careers in STEM fields. This initiative aimed to bridge the gender gap in technology, equipping girls with essential skills and motivating them to explore and excel in the tech industry. *"Their CODE, Their Life"* 





### **DAY OF** ACTION: Sponsored by: youth alive kenya

Girl Up Kenya and Youth Alive Kenya joined forces to create an avenue for Kenya Leadership Summit attendees to address the pressing issues of period poverty and care economy in Kenya. The event, tailored for attendees of the Summit, sought to discuss ways in which we can end period poverty in Kenya while utilizing existing and allocated resources and the importance of care economy. Central to the day's activities were discussions with girls, whose insights will drive future policy changes. These contributions are expected to influence amendments to existing laws or the creation of new legislation concerning menstrual health and care economy. Additionally, the care economy was thoroughly examined, with participants providing valuable opinions on its role in alleviating period poverty. A technical team is set to be established to further develop these insights into actionable policies. This collaborative effort underscores a commitment to leveraging both grassroots and policy-level interventions to ensure comprehensive support for menstrual health and care economy across Kenya.

#### SOME OF THE VIEWS SHARED ON:

#### **MENSTRUAL HEALTH**

- Eliminate taxes on period products.
- NGOs to supply a range of period products, including reusable items and menstrual cups.
- Establish centers where girls can access pads at no cost.
- Develop policies addressing both mental health and menstrual health.
- Collaborate with stakeholders to ensure men understand period poverty extends beyond just a lack of pads.
- Educate the community that period poverty is a human rights issue, not just a women's issue.
- Focus on amplifying accessibility, sustainability, and inclusivity.

#### **CARE ECONOMY**

- Establish mentorship programs for girls in care work.
- Implement policies to improve pay for all care workers.
- Shift focus from imports to increasing local production.
- Advocate for effective policy implementation and collaboration.
- Strengthen the Kenyan economy to create opportunities for growth.
- Recognize and appreciate the work of women and girls in care roles, including fast-tracking ILO initiatives, investing in labor infrastructure, and supporting day care centers.
